**The Chronicles of Atom & Luna** – on **Sunday 20 October** - is an epic fairytale by the acclaimed poet **Murray Lachlan Young**. Set in a world full of myths, fairytales, woods and magic this is a story about strong and curious siblings who go on a magical adventure through nature - think *Grimm Fairy Tales* meets *His Dark Materials* with a touch of Neil Gaiman and Terry Pratchett!

Two teams battle it out for laughs with quick-witted gags, games, sketches and songs inspired by audience suggestions. There's a referee on hand to ensure a good clean match - it's a family friendly show after all - with penalties for bad behaviour and bad jokes. Who wins? The audience decides!

Steven says: "The book was a favourite of my children and reading it to them reminded me how much I had loved it when my grandmother had read it to me."

Steven is best known for his original stories so is it a surprise that he created what is essentially an adaptation of a known title?

"It probably is," he says, "but for those who like my original work, rest assured that I've popped in some of my own suitably silly twists, in keeping with the charming nonsense of the rhyme."
