Hunter King aka Wolfy is a working-class, neurodivergent, transgender drag king, cabaret artist, vocalist, writer, theatremaker and creative producer from Manchester. For over a decade, he has produced and performed work internationally, on stage and screen.

Hunter's debut musical 'A Northern Tr*nny Hootenanny' is inspired by the true story of his transition and how discovering drag and meeting his drag dad, the late, great Valentino King, helped him discover his authentic self. The show draws on his lived experience, the rich history of trans men living their authentic lives in the wild west, his love for Disney and musical theatre.

A self-proclaimed 'Tr*nny', Hunter believes that in this current cultural and political climate, reclamation and visibility are vital. His work is about Trans Hope and Joy and the journey of discovering our authentic self.

The work-in-progress scratch performance of 'A Northern Tr*nny Hootenanny' was platformed in 2024 at Turn on fest - Hope Mill Theatre, LOUD Cabaret - The Met, Pride in Trafford - Waterside Arts and Queer Hope and Joy - Contact.


