

DIGITAL COMMISSION ARTIST BRIEF





BLOOM: TOGETHER WE GROW is a bold, co-created digital installation and immersive performance programme shaped by young people (16–25) from under-represented backgrounds in Trafford.

Guided by themes of growth, identity, and transformation, BLOOM will fuse digital art, performance, and participatory practice to create an inclusive, multi-sensory experience.

BLOOM is a flagship commission of Prism Festival, produced by Waterside Arts in partnership with Night People and local partners such as Young Identity and Gorse Hill Studios.

There are two elements to BLOOM, the first being digital installation/exhibition in our main theatre space, using projection mapping on walls and floor spaces. This will have an element of interactivity and create an inspiring journey for visitors.

The latter being After Dark, club-style performances with immersive visuals informed by young people of Trafford.





COMMISSION BRIEF

We are seeking a digital artist (or collective) to design and produce the digital content that forms the visual heart of BLOOM.

Your work will:

- Create a living digital space for The Garden installation, responding to audience interaction.
- Provide immersive visuals for Bloom After Dark, club-style performance events blending projection, dance, music, and spoken word.
- Reflect and amplify young people's creative input from co-creation workshops.
- Potential to integrate a soundscape into 'The Garden' installation.
- Translate the project's core themes, growth, identity, transformation, into powerful, inclusive digital environments. Formats might include: motion graphics, projection mapping, generative visuals, animation, or interactive media.
- We anticipate that 'The Garden' digital content will run for around 60 minutes and then loop through the day.
- After Dark would run for around 90 minutes in total and may include some elements of 'The Garden' digital content.







WHAT WE OFFER

- Artist Fee: £4,000 (inclusive of design, production, and delivery)
- Production Support: Producer support, technical setup, and projection equipment provided
- Collaboration: Work closely with young people, facilitators, and the artistic team
- Mentorship Role: Guide participants in digital storytelling, offering skill-sharing and inspiration
- Profile & Legacy: A key commission within Prism Festival, with documentation and a digital toolkit to ensure lasting impact
- Facilitated workshops: An opportunity to meet with and explore ideas with young creatives in the borough, to inform the work and outcomes.

- Have an interest in themes of identity, growth, and transformation
- Can deliver work to a high professional standard within the given timeframe
